Letter from the Library Chairwoman:



The New York Young Republican Library Committee and Book Club were created as an ad hoc Committee this year to foster Conservative Literacy and to promote Conservative and Patriotic authors, giving them a platform with an open dialogue. The Library will contain books written by conservative and patriotic authors about political topics but will also contain works on different topics such as economics, finance, and history, to name a few. The Library Committee's initiative of promoting Conservative Literacy started as a goal to combat Critical Race Theory and cancel culture in our nation. There is limited exposure of books written by Conservative authors at universities, public libraries, and other institutions, which excludes them from the public's view of "based" books across the nation.

The Library Committee's Mission Statement:

As the Book Club grows, we hope to create a national "Based Book List" so that Americans are introduced to other alternatives to the book lists that are currently circulated across the nation, which purposely exclude Conservative values and views altogether.

No Holds Barred In Stonewalling Breyer's Replacement

Not too long ago, Left-Wing Guerilla Warfare groups like Demand Justice, funded by Dark-Money Arabella Advisors, launched a personal smear campaign against Justice Kavanaugh. That effort peaked with the issuance of threats against numerous senators, including Senator Susan Collins, who voted for Kavanaugh. A deranged liberal man followed the mid-60-year-old to her door, yelling and pointing a flashlight in her face in the middle of the night. This on top of rape and death threats that led to a hazmat team being called to her house in rural Maine. Senator Collins was fine, and the circus-like atmosphere that surrounded the High Court for weeks actually helped Republicans in the end.

The bloodthirsty and baseless attacks that the Left unleashed energized our base, who know the importance of the Federal Courts, and led the Republican Party to retain our Senate Majority in the 2018 Midterms despite losing the House. Moderate Democrat incumbents lost across the board in North Dakota, Indiana, Missouri, and Florida; many of these Democrats were popular in their states and were expected to win before the Kavanaugh confirmation hearings changed the game. Issues like abortion, gun rights, and religious freedom, fueled non-partisan Conservatives, who have voted for either party in the past, to vote straight-ticket Republican. This was as the attention of the contentious nomination process highlighted how Democrats abandoned moderate stances on the issues and on treating people they disagree with, with dignity. As such, it would behoove Republicans to fight no holds barred to stonewall Breyer's replacement.

Biden will almost certainly nominate Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson. She has the bona fides, being a Harvard Law alum and currently a DC Circuit Judge, while also being a black female. (For those who may not remember, Biden previously said he would only nominate a black female to the court for his first nomination, making her race and sex/gender—if there is a difference anymore in the Democrats' minds—her most qualifying characteristics.) Is Justice Jackson a left-wing radical? Obviously. Is she

particularly qualified? Not at all. Does any of this matter? No. Fighting over the future Justice Jackson will be a tightrope for the Republicans on the Senate Judicial Committee, who are all white men except Marsha Blackburn. While the Fake News Media will surely play into the race and woman cards, what Republicans should do is highlight the issues while not making the hearings personal.

As the Democrats knew in Amy Coney Barrett's confirmation hearings, berating a woman does not play well on TV before an important election—that is why they toned down the nature of their attacks compared to what they did to Kavanaugh. While Republicans need to fight, they must make sure to not make it too nasty as Democrats did with Kavanaugh. Is it unfair compared to what the Democrats did to Kavanaugh? Yes, but it is worth it for a Republican Senate Majority that can slam the brakes on each and every one of Biden's judicial nominations and legislative plans after the Midterms. There are numerous issues that fall within the Supreme Court's domain which Republicans can focus on, where they win by large margins, including vaccine mandates, election integrity laws, and immigration. This is irrespective of more controversial social issues such as abortion and gun rights, which can galvanize the base for the Midterms if Senate Republicans can finally get it together and fight. If Senate Republicans can keep voters' attention on the issues, it would pay dividends in competitive Senate races this year in Georgia, Nevada, Arizona, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, Wisconsin, and New Hampshire.

Club History

Imre Nagy and the Hungarian Revolution of 1956

Imre Nagy was a Hungarian-born revolutionary who led the movement for his country's independence from the Soviet Union. Born June 7th, 1896 in Kaposvar, he was drafted in World War I as a young man. After being captured by the Russians, he joined the communists and even fought in the Red Army. After the War, he moved to the Soviet Union where he watched Stalin transform the landscape of the nation through force and violence.

Eventually, Nagy became a Soviet citizen, but he was certainly no ordinary communist. He was known for enjoying the finer things in life like good food, great drinks, and nice clothing. He spent much of his time in Budapest cafes talking about politics and Hungarian football with his friends.

After World War II, Nagy returned to Soviet-occupied Budapest and helped establish the post-war government. He became one of Hungary's chief rulers, taking over the secret police and harrying anti-communists. For 12 years the Soviet Union pursued a policy of terror against the people of Hungary and other countries in Eastern Europe. Nagy always thought it wasn't necessary for Hungary to follow the Soviet Union in every aspect and hoped for the potential of a Hungarian path to socialism.

Driven by revolutionary spirit, Nagy became the Soviet Premier of Hungary in 1953. He had a vision of a Communist government that would help its people and aimed to liberalize both the economic and political situation in the country in order to address the dire living conditions of the Hungarian

people. The Stalinist form of communism pushed Eastern European nations to shift their economies to produce industrial goods so that the Soviet Union could prepare for war.

Given Hungary was short on resources for large-scale heavy industry, Nagy proposed economic policies for Hungary that put an emphasis on producing consumer goods and reduced taxes. In 1955, he was purged from his Premiership by the Communist Party after accusations of right-wing deviationism.

To counterbalance the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), an alliance was established between the Soviet Union and several Eastern European countries on May 14th, 1955, which became known as the Warsaw Pact. The founding signatories included the following communist governments: Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Hungary, Poland, Romania, and the USSR.

During the summer of 1956, workers in Poland began demonstrating for better working conditions and about 100,000 of them were met with violent repression by Polish-Soviets. It was the first of several mass protests against the communist system that eventually led to the installation of a less Soviet-controlled government.

After seeing the resistance of the Polish people, Hungarians realized change was possible and began organizing to fight for their freedom against an oppressive government. When looking back, the Hungarian effort was the first serious attempt within the Soviet sphere of influence to break free from Moscow.

The following is a timeline of events during the Hungarian Revolution:

On October 23rd, 1956, an anti-Stalinist Hungarian revolt consisting of students and worker groups began. Nagy was called to speak to a crowd of thousands of demonstrators. Some in the crowd demanded a more democratic political system and freedom from Soviet oppression. Others demanded immediate action to dismantle the entire system.

Demonstrating a command of the crowd, Nagy became the leadership symbol of the revolution

and was promoted to Prime Minister. He agreed to allow Soviet troops to remain in Hungary.

On October 24th, Soviet troops with tanks entered Budapest to crush the resistance. Demonstrators remained calm while still demanding reform. As the revolution spread, the secret police (the AVH) were called in to monitor the demonstrators. As the protests turned violent, the AVH opened fire into the crowd and killed three people. The Hungarian Army was called to suppress the resistance but instead joined the side of the protestors. Eventually the AVH did the same. They went further and opened their weapons depot up to the protesters, turning them from demonstrators to rebels.

On October 25th, as the crowd grew larger, the AVH opened fire into the crowd and killed 75 people.

On October 26th, the count increased to 2,000 armed rebels.

On October 27th, Nagy announced the formation of a new government that would adhere to the rebels' demands - including a ceasefire, the exit of Soviet tanks from Budapest and ultimately Hungary, the replacement of the AVH with a new National Guard, the release of 8,000 political prisoners, the allowance of political parties to organize by abolishing the one-party rule, and the restoration of government.

On October 28th, the Communist government wanted Hungary to remain within the Soviet sphere of influence like Poland so the Red Army began to withdraw. The word spread that the Hungarian people won the Revolution and the crowds shouted, "Russians, go home!"

On October 29th, a new skirmish took place. Twenty-three members of the AVH were captured and executed.

On October 30th, reports of anti-communist violence were shared with Moscow. When Moscow heard Nagy decided that Hungary would exit the Warsaw Pact and pursue neutrality, Moscow reversed course and troops began to amass on the Hungarian border. The following day, Imre Nagy formally announced Hungary was withdrawing from the Warsaw Pact.

On November 4th, Moscow sent Soviet tanks and troops back into Budapest to crush the national uprising and brutal repression followed. Martial Law was declared and mass arrests followed.

Eventually, Imre Nagy, the symbol of the Hungarian Revolution, would be secretly tried for

treason. Violence continued until November 8th.

On November 9th, the fighting was over. The violence led to the death of 2,500 Hungarians and 13,000 to 20,000 citizens wounded. In addition, 22,000 were imprisoned and 350 were executed. 700 Soviets were killed and 1,500 others were wounded.

During the uprising, 250,000 Hungarians fled to other countries, of which 30,000 were allowed to enter the United States. As a member of the Club, you would be proud to know that The New York Young Republican Club set up a Hungarian Relief Committee that helped raise funds and met the needs of the Hungarian refugees.

In the end the new Prime Minister of Hungary Janos Kadar led the transition from the 1956 anti-Soviet government of Imre Nagy to the pro-Soviet regime that followed. Kadar managed to convince the Soviet Union to withdraw its troops and allow Hungary a modicum of internal independence after quelling a popular uprising in his country.

On June 16th, 1958, Imre Nagy was executed. Albert C. Petite, the President of the New York Young Republican Club at that time, put out a statement extending the Club's sympathy to the families, friends, and associates of Imre Nagy, General Pal Maleter, and the people of Hungary. In 1989, 31 years after his execution, Imre Nagy was reburied with full honors.

In 1999, amid much debate within the organization and Russian opposition, Hungary, Poland, and the Czech Republic were the first countries of the former Eastern Bloc to join NATO following the fall of the Soviet Union.

In 2004, Hungary joined the European Union. As the EU grew, it required that any new member met a series of basic criteria: that its democratic systems were robust, that its judiciary system was independent, and that its authorities respected the rule of law and the rights of minorities.

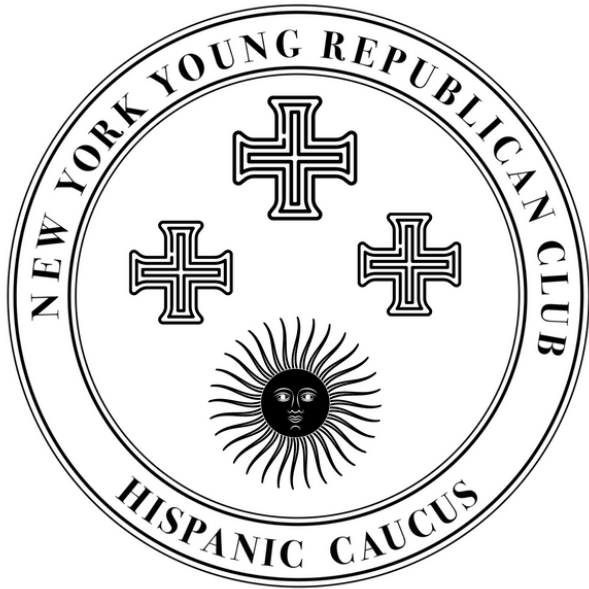
In 2010, Viktor Orban became Prime Minister of Hungary and is up for reelection again this year. His core values are conservative, Christian, democratic, and patriotic, which are in sharp contrast to those of Brussels but in line with our organization. The European Union's "woke politics" are commensurate with the international liberal mainstream.

This coming election, like Imre Nagy and his revolutionaries, Prime Minister Viktor Orban will fight for the will of the people, putting Hungary First above the woke EU! Stay tuned!

With a population of over 62 million, or 19% of the nation's population, Latinos make up the largest minority group in the nation, the majority of which are first and second generation citizens. Better still, the Latino demographic skews younger than most minority groups in the United States. 31% of the Hispanic American population are under the age of 18 and the median age of Hispanic Americans is 29.8 years, well under the median age of 38.5 for the entire United States population.

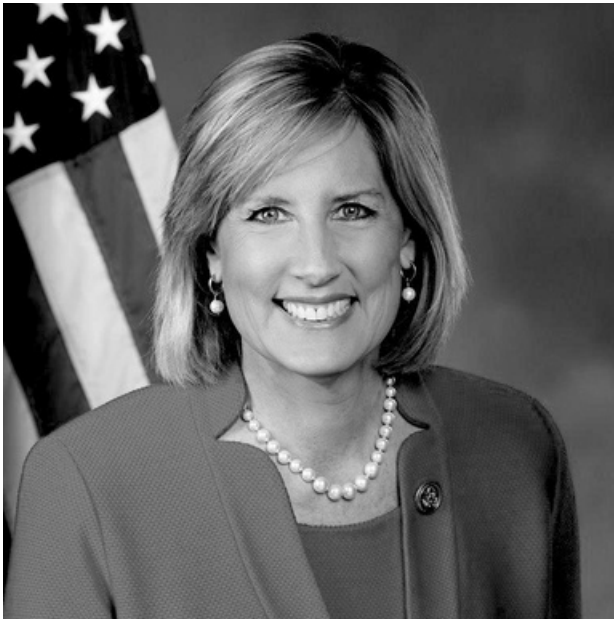


the Democrat Party rule in New York State, and supports an end to the corruption in Albany. Rodríguez promises to be a “watchdog” for New York taxpayers.
